Hello BPS Families,

A warm (literally) welcome back to all of you. I'm excited to get to know your children and work with the whole school community to provide a happy and engaging school for your child to learn at.

As a school we have been working hard on implementing our Berry Street Education strategies including the use of morning circles, regular brain breaks and using common language such as 'Track the Speaker' to get the students tuned in and 'ready to learn'. This term we will be continuing with this concept of being 'ready to learn' and having a whole-school approach to checking-in with our students during the day. This will ensure we are aware of student readiness before teaching a lesson and finding ways to develop their self-awareness.

Our SRCs are working hard to increase engagement and create a safe environment for all students to play and learn in. At the moment we are exploring the use of Peer Mediators, a Student Hub (safe space for students to come at lunch time) and planning to run an UP sleepover and a cake stall at Sports Day. These ideas came in consultation with the classes and this is being led by the student leaders.

Our School and House Captains are going to be busy helping to keep up with House Points collected from assemblies for positive yard behaviours, reading in the library and engaging in school events such as our Cross Country (by running or dressing up). These leaders are also going to be helping run the Launchpad reading/homework room in the mornings and will be able to listen to younger students read and help them with their homework. They are very excited about this.
