## 'Primary Schools lantern parade set for big return'

STUDENTS at a Riverland primary school have constructed more than 400 lanterns in celebration of an annual Vietnamese tradition.

Berri Primary School will hold its annual Moon Lantern Festival, featuring a parade of hand-made lanterns, on Thursday, September

Language teacher, and organiser of the event, Mai Schloithe said anticipation was high among students after last year's festival was cancelled due to Covid-19.

was cancelled due to Covid-19.

"We're nearly finished all the kids' lanterns;" Ms Schloithe said.

"The families are still working on theirs, but it's all looking really positive.

"This is our fourth Moon Lantern Festival.

We were planning one last year, but we had to cancel it due to Covid-19."

Ms Schloithe said traditional techniques and materials were used to construct the lanterns.

"Every child in the school has made their own lantern, and then we have big and elaborate lanterns their families have made as well," she said.

"Traditionally they are made out of cane, and we've kept with that, and we use a special tissue paper to make the lantern.

"We'll have around 400 to 500 hand-made lanterns on the night."

Ms Schloithe said the festival would also feature traditional lion dancing performances

by students.
"On the night we'll have dancing inspired by other cultures," she said.
"Our music teacher has been helping the kids learn the drumming of the dance, which


# Rooms 20/21 CIVICS & CITIZENSHIP

Students in Rooms 20 & 21 are developing their knowledge and understanding of the concepts of citizenship, government and democracy in Civics and Citizenship lessons this term. They are exploring the key values of Australia's democratic system of government; freedom, equality, fairness and justice. They have investigated the role of groups in our community and how people participate in groups to achieve shared goals. The students are now learning about representative democracy and exploring the importance of voting in Australia's democracy together with the roles and responsibilities of electors and representatives in our electoral process. 




































## BERRI BLAZERS BASKETBALL CLUB TRIALS


All players must attend a minimum of 2 trials to be considered for selection for a team.
