
Year 5/6 Camp

This term, the UP building completed three days at Woodhouse Activity Centre in the Adelaide Hills. The teachers were supported by John (Pastoral Care Worker) and parents: Nathan, Steve, Bronnie and Donna. They were an excellent support to the teachers and added another layer of support for students throughout the camp.

It was an exciting and resilience-building camp where students were able to complete challenging tasks such as: Orienteering, Challenge Hill (obstacle course), Tube Sliding, complete team challenges, Survivor (teaching students how to make fire and shelter), Disc Golf (think of a golf course with a frisbee), Laser Skirmish (muddy paths, covert operations as team versus team tried to gain ground over one anothermany laughs and messy falls), rock climbing and evening activities at night (trivia, dorm room 'Showtime' and a movie with popcorn).

The students learned a lot about teamwork, respect and responsibility as they needed to organise themselves each day, keep their dormitory clean and be ready for daily inspections (dorms were awarded points and prizes for showing positive values and having the tidiest living areas). They worked hard to show resilience and persistence throughout the days and nights as we endured rain, hail and sunshine, as well as being away from home. Each student was responsible for being ready each day and ensuring that their group returned from each activity for rest breaks. Each group also had a lunch and dinner duty where they did dishes, wiped tables or chairs and tidied the dining room ready for the next meal. Speaking of meals... we were well looked after with many dietary requirements catered for as well as cooked breakfasts, morning tea, lunch, afternoon tea and dinner every day. It was well-earned after the days' activities (we averaged 16,000-20,000 steps per day).

Overall, the Year 5/6 camp was everything we hoped it would be: fun, challenging collaborative; it embodied our school values and learner qualities. Our Year 5/6 students were excellently behaved and represented Berri Primary School proudly, making it a great camp atmosphere for all. Pillowcase Program

On Wednesday Room 26 & 27 children were visited by Red Cross to learn and participate in the Pillowcase Program.

The Pillowcase Program

The Pillowcase Program was originally inspired by events during Hurricane Katrina in the US. While evacuating campus, students of a local University used pillowcases to carry their cherished and basic possessions. After hearing this, American Red Cross staff developed the concept of using a pillowcase as an emergency kit. The program quickly grew into a preparedness education program that has since become known as the Pillowcase Program.

Delivered by Red Cross volunteers and staff, the workshop encourages children to be active participants in their own emergency preparedness. The content is useful for all kinds of emergencies and includes activities to highlight the importance of being prepared. Pillowcase helps to reduce real and imagined fears and has successfully built children's stress management skills.

Aimed at students in Years 3 and 4 (ages 8-10), the one hour workshop involves engaging discussions and interactive activities to help students:

- · Understand and discuss the importance of being prepared
- · Prepare their mind for the thoughts and feelings that may arise before, during and after an emergency
- · know what to pack in an emergency kit

Each student is then given a pillowcase to decorate and take home, to start their own personal emergency kit.


