WHAT IS FOOTBALL IN SCHOOLS?

Football in Schools is an introductory program for those new to the game of Football (Soccer). This program is designed to give primary aged children a great first experience of Soccer. The Soccer in Schools program is run once a week for an 8-week period, going for 1-hour duration. The program will develop basic Soccer skills in a safe and positive environment, with a strong emphasis on fun Soccer activities. Each participant will receive a drawstring bag, Soccer and shin guards. Soccer in Schools is supported by the Government of South Australia allowing us to use the Sports Voucher for this program, therefore making it a free program (if you use the voucher).
