

GUIDELINES FOR STUDENT DRESS-CODE

Rationale

Berri Primary School promotes a school identity through a set of guidelines for student dress based on school colours. The wearing of School uniform colours is an important safety factor in that we can clearly recognise students' association with our school. It also demonstrates a greater sense of pride, belonging and connection to Berri Primary School for students. Clothing should be worn which allows freedom of movement and a level of comfort as seasons change.

At all times the shoulders must be covered.

When representing the school, students will be expected to wear school colours, including a polo shirt with the school logo.

CLOTHING WHICH IS UNSUITABLE FOR SCHOOL WEAR

SHOES: Thongs, bare feet, high heeled shoes, strapless sandals, ugg boots

CLOTHING: Very brief - short shorts/ skirts/ dresses, sleeveless T-shirts, singlets, bathers, clothing with offensive messages

PEIRCINGS: Facial piercings/ hooped or large earrings

COLOURS: Avoid wearing other colours such as black

SUNSMART POLICY

In accordance with the School SunSmart Policy, the wearing of hats is compulsory in Terms 1 and 4. In Terms 2 and 3 hats must still be kept at school but will only need to be worn if the UV level is higher than 3.

This will be checked each day on the Bureau of Meteorology website. Hats must be wide brimmed or of a legionnaire design. Students also must wear tops which cover the shoulders and upper arms.

Bike Helmets are required by law for all children who ride to school.
